

Addendum to Eversley Primary School Behaviour Policy

Full-Opening after COVID-19

September 2021

Expectations of all children attending school, is that they will:

- Follow any altered routines within school.
- Follow the school's rules on handwashing with soap and hot water or hand sanitiser
- Follow the school's rules on using the toilets hygienically, ensuring they wash their hands after going to the toilet
- Cough into their elbow and catch sneezes in tissues, following the 'Catch it, bin it, kill it' expectations
- Wash their hands after catching a sneeze
- Place used tissues in the lidded bin in their classroom
- Remain seated at their desk and not wander around the classroom
- Only use their own stationery and equipment at their work station, and not share items with other children
- Follow adult instructions, including those pertaining to systems and measures in place to reduce the risk of infection.
- Not share food or drink with others
- Only bring into school essential items in a book bag or small back pack, which are: a coat, a hat, a filled water bottle and a packed lunch (if not purchasing a school packed lunch) and reading diary.
- Continue to follow the school's expectation on wearing appropriate school uniform
- Continue to follow the school's expectations on respecting their peers and adults so that learning can take place and so that all in school can remain as safe as possible and happy.
- Use Microsoft Teams appropriately when completing homework at home or remote learning (in the case of a school or local outbreak).

These expectations will be sent home for parents to share with their children prior to starting back at school. They will also be shared with children on their first day in school to remind them of our expectations.

Should children continually and deliberately not follow these rules, then in line with the school's existing Behaviour Policy (available on the school website), the school will use its range of consequences and meet with parents to discuss whether the school is able to accommodate safely their child at Eversley Primary School.
