Supersonic Phonic Friends is a systematic approach that has been approved by the Government for the teaching of Phonics.

What is Phonics at Eversley?

- Supersonic Phonic Friends is based on the Letters and Sounds programme
- > It is a stepped, 1-5, systematic approach
- We access the Supersonic Phonic Friends resources to enhance our teaching and learning.
- We teach children to be able to listen to sounds in words
- We help them to recognise and remember the spelling for the sounds in words
 - We teach them to build and read words using flash cards and decodeable text
 - Then teach them to apply their phonics help them to write words

What do we want for our children?

We want to encourage...

- a can do ethos
- a love of books, rhymes, poems and songs.

- clever conversations
- new and interesting vocabulary.
- Story making and telling
- engagement with text of all types.
- a confidence to try something new.

Sid is funny, cute and sneaky... not to mention a little bit cheeky!




Jazzy Jack and Magic Mack


Jack and Mack help us to hear more than 3 sounds in a word, they bring the sound to life so it can be heard.




Suze and Mitch










Year 1 Phonics Screening

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This isn't till June, so lets not worry too soon!

Reading Books

We will send home reading books with your child that are linked to the phonics phase they are secure at.

To begin with your child may have brought home a book without any words. This is an important part of the teaching of reading. Children need to be able to speak about pictures and tell their own stories and we encourage you to do this with them.



Application Decodeable – matching my phonics All phases The children's Phonics books will be changed weekly. They need to be reading these daily. The sharing books are chosen by the children and they are to share with you. Queen's Maid Illustrated by Jess



What will we do?

- Teach your child phonics 4 x a week following specific consistent steps in teaching
- Teach your child a tricky word session weekly alongside phonics.
- ✓ Monitor and assess your child
- ✓ Keep you updated on your child's progress through parents evenings and 1:1 discussion where appropriate

- Send home work to support your child's phonological awareness
- Share ideas and send home games and resources for you to play at home, where appropriate
- ✓ Share apps/ websites with you to download

What can you do?

- ✓ Come to progress meetings and know where your child is up to
- Talk to your child about the new learning for the week ask them to teach it to you – little and often
- ✓ Play games and use resources with your child little and often
- ✓ Download apps and log on to websites with your child
- ✓ Read with and to your child regularly
- ✓ Ask if you are unsure we are happy to help! ☺
