Earrings

Under Essex guidelines, children are unable to take part in PE with earrings in.

We kindly ask that children with pierced ears do not wear earrings on their PE days (please speak to your child's teacher to find out their regular PE days) or have been taught how to remove them independently. We are unable to tape up earrings for PE activities.

Please be reminded that only studs should be worn as earrings for school uniform.

Dropping Off

We kindly ask that to help with a smooth start to the school day, parents drop their child off at the gates each morning and do not escort them to their classroom. In exceptional circumstances, parents can bring their children into school. If this applies to your child please speak to either Mrs Pepper or Mr Hancock on the gate to arrange this.

If you have a message for the class teacher, please pass on to the adults on the gate, contact the School Office or speak to your child's teacher at the end of the day.

Also, when dropping children at the gate, please move away from the entrance to enable other children to get into school.
