School Uniform

Below is a reminder of some of our stipulations around Eversley school uniform:

Shoes should be plain black with no white or coloured piping, patterns or logos.

Hair accessories should be in school colours (blue or brown) or white or black, and not too big.

PE kits should be plain black tracksuit bottoms and tops (no white or coloured piping, patterns or logos).







Following rules set by Essex Local Authority, children are unable to take part in PE lessons or after-school sports clubs with earrings in. All earrings **must** be removed. We are not allowed to tape over earrings for sports lessons or clubs.

Back to School Advice from the UK Health and Security Agency (UKHSA)

There are 5 simple steps parents can take to reduce infections spreading in the community:

- **1. Teach good hygiene habits** Regularly wash hands in soap and warm water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser. Use a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes, bin it and then wash hands.
- **2. Stop the spread of stomach bugs** If you or your child have diarrhoea and vomiting, wash your hands with soap and warm water and use bleach-based products to clean surfaces. You should avoid visiting people in hospitals and care homes. Do not return to work, school or nursery until 48 hours after symptoms have stopped.
- **3. Spot the signs of when to keep your child at home** If your child has a fever and is unwell, they should stay home from school until the fever has passed and they are well enough to attend.

If you suspect your child has <u>scarlet fever</u>, contact your local GP and if your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over.

4. Get vaccinated - Flu vaccines can be booked through your GP or <u>local pharmacy</u>. You can take a look at the <u>childhood vaccination schedule</u> to make sure your child is up to date with all their vaccinations.
