

PE and Sport Premium – Eversley Primary School 2016/17

A joint injection of funding by the Department of Education, Health and Sport has been provided as a significant boost for PE and Sport in primary schools. This is specifically to meet the needs of pupils and precisely how schools spend this money may vary to particular circumstances. The sports premium is set at £8000 with an additional £5.00 per pupil.

Eversley Primary School recognises the contribution of PE and Sport to the health and well-being of pupils and considers that an outstanding PE curriculum along with additional opportunities has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of pupils. We aim to accelerate the learning of all children.

Our aims are to:

- Improve the provision of our PE and sport
- Commit to ensuring that all children receive high quality and well-planned PE
- Offer an increased and broader range of competitive sporting activities
- Provide additional resources including teaching materials
- Provide specialist teaching
- Increase the range of additional opportunities
- Offer opportunities to engage our least active pupils
- Facilitate professional development for staff
- Increased the participation of pupils
- Plan for sustainability

Review and Planning

So far the impact of the funding support for our provision includes:

- Updated curriculum plans and the implementation of a progressive scheme of work that includes a broader range of opportunities – this has enhanced pupil engagement and enjoyment and has promoted a healthy active lifestyle
- Clear curriculum links to specific competitive activities with other schools resulting in more pupils involved in more competitions and a broader experience of a range of sports and activities on offer
- Additional activities organised and targeted for pupils who are less active has resulted in a greater number of pupils taking exercise, for example Change for Life events at partner school and Basildon Games events
- Collaborative work with a secondary school PE provision has impacted on our quality of teaching via CPD that has provided greater technical knowledge for staff, this has also facilitated additional extra-curricular activities – including dance for both key stages

- A specialist sport coach is part funded by the premium grant to support PE and extra-curricular sport, with a focus on teacher development and increasing the number and quality of extra-curricular opportunities
- Further CPD opportunities, including one-to-one support and group training activities have been provided to upskill staff in specific areas, i.e. gymnastics coaching
- A wider variety of sporting activities has been offered to encourage participation, increasing numbers evidences success e.g. cheerleading
- Specialist Eversley Leisure Centre opportunities are now part funded for all pupils, these include a varied range of activities, including; trampolining, mini-golf, badminton and circuit training
- Access for parents to physical activity has developed well with regular teams of parents and their children taking part in 3k runs and boot camp activities
- Additional resources have supported enhanced teaching

Plans for sustainability:

- In school development of purchased schemes of work
- Continued support to develop the curriculum by the secondary sports partnership
- Additional PE and sports development by raising the quality of PE teaching throughout the school
- CPD of staff to build on the previously delivered training and specialist coaching
- Increase the number and range of in-school competitions, e.g. dodge ball day
- Develop the infant extra-curricular provision to include a wider range of sports clubs
- Hosting competitive sport, e.g. The Great East Run
- Strategically planned replacement and renewal of the increased range of resources
- Leisure Centre activities to be jointly led by our trained staff, e.g. trampoline sessions, spin classes
- Continued commitment to Basildon Education Partnership sporting activities to support PE and school sport
- Further development of sporting extra-curricular activities by trained school and specialist staff
- Targeting sponsorship and fundraising to develop the provision further
- Promotion of the range of opportunities via school activities, e.g. assemblies, film, awards
- Involvement in a wider range opportunities for parents, i.e. greater promotion of active family learning and active Basildon Education partnership provision, increased participation in Team Eversley 3k runs
